Fleet Town Council Budget & Precept 2025/26

Band D Precept £131.27 per year / £2.52 per week

Budget planning for the next financial year has been challenging due to the impact of central government's increases to employer National Insurance contributions and the anticipated inflationary impact that will have on indirect costs.

Careful money management and ensuring the best value for residents, means we are able to continue offering our full range of services to meet our vision for the town, and plan for the future. Consequently, at the Council meeting in December 2024, the Council agreed that the precept will increase for the coming year by 36 pence per week for a Band D household. This represents excellent value for money for the range of public services, leisure and recreation facilities we provide for our residents.

infrastructure, and improvements, the friends of group brings the community together for events, fundraising, and restoration. Last year's trespass incident at Basingbourne Park tested this partnership. After the unauthorised encampment left waste and damage, the council acted swiftly to clear the area and ensure safety. The friends of group rallied volunteers to restore the park, adding final touches that helped it shine again. Together, we not only repaired the damage but revitalised the park, ensuring it remained a welcoming space for everyone. This collaboration didn't go unnoticed. Our joint efforts helped secure a Gold Award in the South & South East in Bloom awards, a testament to what we can achieve when the Council and community work hand in hand.






Town in Bloom: A Growing Commitment to Nature

There are Oscar winners, Bafta winners and Golden Globe winners... but who would you rather sing with on stage than the coolest man on TV - Shaun Williamson.


With his trademark warm and jovial manner, accompanying and singing with audience and guest participants on stage, creating a riotous, joyous moment that people will never forget.
