Devolution — What services do you Value?

The National Association of Local Councils has recently published an interesting paper entitled "Local Service delivery and place-shaping: A framework to support Parish and Town Councils." Why are County and District Councils looking to devolve services to Town and Parish Councils? Fairly obviously, this is currently being driven by those higher tier councils looking to minimize costs. Some local Town and Parish Councils are

already seeking to take over some local services because they feel that service is not being delivered adequately or because they feel they can do it better and their residents would appreciate the improved service.

One example is Chippenham Council which has elected to take on road sweeping. This has involved purchasing a 17-tonne road sweeper, a smaller tyred sweeper, pick up trucks and 10 additional staff. All this had to be paid for out of the Council's precept which has meant a fairly dramatic 40% rise in the Band D local council tax to £270.44 per annum, but residents are now receiving a much-valued service and cleaner neighbourhood.

The position is that Town and Parish Councils are not restricted in how much the precept can

be increased. The philosophy is, if local residents want and value a service, then they have the option to pay for it... **Continued Page 3**

Is your front garden affecting Climate Change?

There was an interesting but quite disturbing article in the Sunday Times at the end of August that said there was evidence that 12 square miles of front gardens in our capital were under paving, the equivalent of 22 Hyde Parks. As, quite rightly stated by a member of the London Assembly, "had a real park been lost there would be a public outcry."

Can you imagine the local public reaction had we put forward a proposal to concrete over Oakley Park? Well, just like London we are seeing front gardens across Fleet put under paving blocks or bonded aggregate. There is a Neighbourhood Plan Policy that calls for 50% of front gardens to be maintained as soft landscaping, partly to maintain local character and minimize flood risk but, more importantly, to protect biodiversity and reduce the loss of carbon absorbing green vegetation.



The article in the Times was focused on the impact of vehicles having to be parked on front gardens to facilitate the charging of electric vehicles. We don't have to wait for the advent of more electric vehicles as we are experiencing the problems now. The number of cars

per household is increasing as a response to the lack of a meaningful alternative to the private car, in particular alternative public transport... ...There are few planning restrictions on paving over front gardens, but permission is required for concrete surfaces of more than five square metres. Few people appear to realize this but



Fleet Town Council, as consultees on planning applications submitted to Hart District Council, is well aware and making our voice heard.

On the same topic, Hart District Council has declared a Climate Emergency and we all need to play our part in minimizing the impacts of climate change. Alan Titchmarsh has an ingenious solution, stating that gardens full of plants such as sedum and heather can grow under a car and two narrow strips of paving for the wheels is all that is required. "If everybody did this, the green patches join together to make an enormous patchwork quilt." Alan went on to say "if we all block pave our front gardens, we are paving our way to disaster. The wildlife which visits your garden needs you every bit as much as the planet needs you. Don't imagine that by just negating that little bit of nature near you that it doesn't make a difference, because it does."

Watch out for your invitation – Chairman's Coffee Mornings are coming back!

Prior to the Pandemic, Chairman's coffee mornings had been taking place and recommenced in September 2021.

These Coffee Mornings allow Fleet Town Council to stay in touch with Fleet residents and understand what would make a difference to their life in Fleet. To do this, a small number of randomly selected residents are invited to join the Chairman and their ward Councillors for a Coffee and to tell us what they like and don't like about living in Fleet.



The next Coffee morning will be for residents in the Fleet Central Ward. Watch out for your invitation. This is your opportunity to tell us about your experience and expectations of living in Fleet.

Fleet Cemetery - New Plot Finder

A new search facility has now been added to our website which members of the public can use to easily locate their loved ones within Fleet Cemetery. This search facility not only tells you the plot number, but also connects to a map to show the location of that plot within The Cemetery. To use the facility you can provide a plot number (if you know it) or search by name. Previously to find a plot you could search the record lists/maps located within the central shelter in the Cemetery so we hope this will make things easier for those wanting to visit. This new facility can also be used to help those with geneology interests.

Continued from Page 1... Devolution — What services do you Value?

The difficult bit is knowing what residents really value. Back in 2010, before the concept of downward devolution was conceived, Hart District Council devolved responsibility to Fleet Town Council for park and green space maintenance, operation and management of the Cemetery, operation and management of The Harlington, provision of local community bus services, contribution towards maintenance of the Basingstoke Canal and support of local charity and community groups for starters.



Hart used to collect an amount of money from Fleet, Church Crookham and Elvetham Heath residents, called Special Expenses to pay for these local services and the three new parish councils agreed to take on the services at the same cost.

Hopefully, it is appreciated that the parks have been better managed, the Cemetery improved and extended, The Harlington maintained and expanded in its scope of activities and the high street made more welcoming with its summer flower displays and Christmas lights. The Town Council also has continued to support valued local services like the Point youth services, the Community Store and our local Scout and Guide troops.

Is there any more we can do? Of course, there is, but the key issue is we cannot undertake additional services without additional funding and the one thing that is not devolved is the funding. Town and Parish councils have to increase their precepts to take on these additional responsibilities from the higher tier councils, but the higher tier councils rarely, if ever, reduce their tax levels. Civic Quarter Regeneration

It appears that the Civic Quarter regeneration project has stalled. This is understandable as the pandemic has caused no end of things to pause. During 2019/20, a working group of Hart District Councillors together with representatives from Hampshire County Council and Fleet Town Council discussed plans to revive this area and agreed that any plans would be subject to a public consultation to gauge residents' views.

Events have, however, moved the timeframes and the next stage in the discussions is yet to be announced. Fleet Town Council is obviously anxious for the project to resume. The Harlington, which is managed and operated by the Town Council, is an important part of this site and can play a vital role in the move to a more leisure orientated high street.

The Fleet Neighbourhood Plan stipulates that any plans



We will have seen the news that, at the end of September after trading for over a 100 years, Baker and Sons finally closed their doors and ended an era. This has provided a further clear sign that the high street is shrinking. National and regional brands have deserted towns like Fleet and reduced their commercial property presence to save money.

The move to online shopping has accelerated even faster than was envisaged as a consequence of the Covid shutdowns and many, having experienced the convenience of keyboard shopping, will not return. So, we are seeing our high streets occupied by non-traditional services e.g. foot clinics, physios, yoga studios, computer gaming studios and climbing walls. Services such as coffee shops, hairdressers, nail bars, Vape stores and...





...mobile phone accessories now predominate over traditional retail.

The local retailers are having to work harder to remain viable and will only survive if they meet local needs and provide exceptional service. Retailers will not disappear, just become more diluted in the cocktail of the high street.
