The COVID-19 restrictions have been lifted, we had the hottest and driest Summer on record. We enjoyed the most fantastic Platinum Jubilee Celebrations; four days of fun and family fair. The weather was kind right until the end, a little rain dampened the final street party, but not the enthusiasm for Fleet residents to enjoy a major community event. A huge thank you to the organizing committee and all the residents of Fleet who turned out in support.

Then, tragically, out of the blue, our enduring Monarch was not well, but still she managed to accept the resignation of our then Prime Minister and receive our new incumbent Liz Truss. It was the Queen's last official act, but at 96 years old it was a dream that she could last forever and thankfully she passed away peacefully in one of her favourite residences.

We have all just witnessed a period of national mourning and a display of pomp and ceremony that showed just how much loved and respected our late Queen was. With great assistance from the Fleet and Crookham District Branch of the



Royal British Legion we were able to call a gathering of residents at the War Memorial to join in the National Moment of Reflection.

Some 600 to 800 residents of all ages joined in the ceremony.

In that brief celebration of a life, one could sense the spirit of community that so often reveals itself in Fleet and makes it such a pleasurable place to live.

Within this cocktail of change we also had local elections back in May - the Town Council only renews itself once every four years. A number of long-standing Councillors decided to stand down and give some new blood the opportunity to bring some fresh ideas to the Council, but regrettably as only one of the five wards required an election, the remainder of our Councillors were returned uncontested.

Additionally, within this period of change our Clerk, Janet Stanton, who has diligently and effectively served the Council for 12 years, retired at the end of September, so on your behalf we wish her a long, full and happy retirement.

As there always is in life, there is good and bad. We have enjoyed lots of good things this summer, but whether the confinement of COVID-19 was a factor, we have suffered some extreme anti-social behaviour amongst some of our younger residents and some extremely noisy and fast driving by some of our not so young residents. Excessive drinking and drug taking are contributing factors. We are designated a low crime area, therefore we are only supported by a limited police presence. I know that many residents have been totally frustrated by the inability to report incidents to the police because dialing 101 can mean hanging on the phone for 45 minutes or more with no response. Back in May we had a visit by our Police and Crime Commissioner, Donna Jones,



who admitted to the failings of the 101 system but committed to improving it. It hasn't improved yet so we will be challenging Ms Jones to deliver.

Fortunately, some residents have taken it upon themselves to supplement our limited police force. We have a dedicated group of local residents who operate a Community Speed Watch. This group provides valuable evidence that the police will act upon to confront repeat speeding offenders or bring the police radar team into the area.

Another group of active residents is the Neighbourhood Watch. The Pandemic hurt the membership and they lost a number of volunteers who helped keep in touch with the community. More members are needed as joining will help keep this a low crime area. With enough members in a road or area, a sign can be erected to warn criminals that they are being watched. Neighbourhood



Watch is part of a nationwide organization helping bring security to local communities.

On a more positive note we are very lucky to have a whole body of volunteers to

support all sorts of activity and good causes. Without them Fleet would not be such a good place to live. Fleet Town Council is committed to helping those groups in anyway that it can. We cannot thank them enough for their part in making Fleet such a great community spirited town.

### **Ancells Green Gym**

At July's Full Council meeting members of Fleet Town Council approved an \$106 application being made to Hart District Council to fund a new Green Gym in Ancells Farm Park.

For information S106 is money contributed by developers to the local planning authority (Hart) towards the costs of providing community and social infrastructure to mitigate the impact of their development on the local community/infrastructure - the Gym would, pending approval, be funded by this developer money and not from Council Tax.

For good measure and public reassurance, a survey of local residents was conducted online during August and September to confirm that the Gym was still wanted and to see what equipment was desired and the location preferences within the park. ### **New Footpaths**

### Lea Wood Road / New Barn Close

A new footpath has been installed outside All Saints School, between New Barn Close and Lea Wood Road. The new rubber path meets SUDS (Sustainable Urban Drainage) standards which is permeable and will enable better access for all.

### Oakley Park

Two of the main paths in Oakley Park have also had a new layer of tarmac put down. Both paths, leading from Albany Road, one beside the Pavilion and the other running up to Burnside alleyway, were in poor condition and not easily accessible however, both paths are now wheelchair and pushchair friendly.


