What's new....

New Garden of Reflection

The final touches are now being completed on the new Garden of Reflection at Fleet Cemetery. This Garden provides a quiet space for remembrance and reflection and includes a new attractive garden for the burial and scattering of ashes, planting of memorial trees/bushes and installation of memorials and plaques. Previously, this part of the Cemetery was mainly grassed and could not be used for full burials due to the high water table.

On entering the Garden of Reflection through a rose planted brick and wrought iron arch, visitors will enter a delightful tranquil area with meandering accessible paths, seating areas for quiet reflection and bridges crossing a dry stream leading to a solar powered water feature. There is woodland planting for the scattering of ashes, memorial kerb stones will edge the paths and two garden areas either side of the archway for the burial of ashes and stone memorials.

Fleet Cemetery (Richard Close) is the only local authority Cemetery serving Fleet and the surrounding areas. With all the new developments in the area and the current rate of internments there are only enough grave spaces for the next 10-15 years however, the trend is moving from full burials towards cremations and this garden provides another area to accommodate this.

Our new memorials are now installed and ready to give a different option to remember your loved one by. There will also be a new children's area where families can relax and remember. Basingbourne Park Over 8's Play Area

Children living around the Basingbourne Park area will be delighted to see that a new £53,000 Over 8's playground and teenage recreation equipment have been installed to complement the existing Under 8's playground.

The Over 8's play area is centred around a challenging timber multi-play unit consisting of 2 bannister slides, overhead and vertical ladders, horizontal climbing net, hanging and overhead grips and rope play. Completing this area is an accessible Basket swing, a fixed net climbing frame, an overhead twister, an accessible horizontal see saw and ski simulator, plus segting



an accessible horizontal see saw and ski simulator, plus seating. The Teens will have their own area which will include an open youth shelter and a heavy duty goal and basketball hoop.

Says Cllr Paul Einchcomb, Chairman of FTC Recreation, Leisure and Amenities Committee, "Fleet Town Council is very keen to promote young people's health and well-being. The installation of this much needed play and recreation equipment by the Town Council will provide facilities that support these aims and encourage a lifelong enjoyment of the outdoors.

This project is part of a Fleet Town Council programme of bringing new or improved outdoor recreation play into all the Fleet parks and the next project is a brand new playground in Calthorpe Park – a park serving a very large residential area which does not have any informal children's activities.

Finally and very importantly, I want to give the Council's thanks to an extra special group of local residents, The Friends of Basingbourne Park, who have given not only their support to this project but have also fundraised a staggering £12,660 towards this community venture. Thank you."

An update on The Harlington Development

Consultation Results

The consultation ("Do you support the building of a new Harlington community complex on Gurkha Square?") again failed to excite a response from the majority of Fleet residents. Returns from only 18% of the electorate resulted in 60% of the responses rejecting development on Gurkha Square. 1,874 residents returned a NO vote compared to 1,245 voting YES. As a result of the consultation, it was decided at Fleet Town Council's December Full Council Meeting, to withdrawn the planning application for Gurkha Square.



What now?

Ever feel you have been there before? At the start of 2017 we had no idea what the preference of the local residents was on the Repair, Refurbishment or the Replacement options for The Harlington. We are now aware that although many residents of Fleet wanted a new building, they were not happy with building on Gurkha Square. At the time this was the only location offered by Hart District Council (HDC). We are continuing to

work with HDC who, in November 2018 offered the alternative location of Victoria Road car park. This is just one of the options Fleet Town Council will be exploring.

To start the process, we have just launched a tender to undertake a detailed condition survey of the overall state of the building and of the integrity of the concrete frame, will it last another 40 to 50 years? We will keep everyone informed.

Buses in Fleet

From the 17th February there will be changes to the No. 7 and No. 10 Bus services.

The no. 7 service - Aldershot - Fleet - Elvetham Heath service will only be running a limited service between Fleet and Hartley Wintney and the early morning commuter service between Elvetham Heath and Fleet Station has been withdrawn. The no. 10 service - Farnborough - Fleet - Church Crookham has been changed from once every 30 mins to once an "hour". The BIG Conversation

Just before Christmas the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government launched a Future High Street Fund. Potentially £675 million to regenerate town centres to make them fit for purpose addressing the deficiencies in high streets to meet the impacts of internet shopping and the changing habits of residents. As one pundit put it "we used to go out shopping and come home for a coffee, now we go out for a coffee and come home to do our shopping."

This presents the opportunity for the District Council, the Town Council, the County Council, Fleet BID and Community Groups to come together to identify the "deficiencies" in our high street and

put forward a plan to make the high street sustainable and fit for the 21st century.

Have we been here before? In 2009 Hart District Council consulted on a proposed regeneration of Fleet's high street which was not supported by the residents of Fleet and created the vacuum of the last 10 years.



Times have changed and shopping is no longer the sole purpose of the high street. The Fund prospectus suggests "People want local high streets to provide convenience, a sense of community and to add value through services not offered online....they are the locus of some of the highest levels of social interaction"

Not unsurprisingly the prospectus introduces housing into the mix and uses the word "densification" which is a euphemism for "flats" but, it does recognise that infrastructure is important and makes reference to "improving transport access, traffic flows and circulation in the area."

What do you think our high street should look like? We'll come back to that later.

The Town Clerk and Chairman attended the Spring Conference of the National Association of Local Councils. There were two hot topics. One was the Government's Future High Street Fund and the other was Devolution. Services which have been the domain of the County and District Councils are being passed down to Town and Parish Councils but, without the associated funding! Local residents pay for the service or it dies. One such example is the County Council's withdrawal of funding for non eligible children on the school bus from Ancells Farm to Velmead School. The service can be continued but, with a significant contribution by parents

and the Town Council agreeing to make up any shortfall in the County's cost of running the service.

Do you have a view on what you would be happy to support at the local level if a higher authority withdrew its traditional funding?



It is a slightly hackneyed term, but we would like to start a "Big Conversation". We proposed to use the Annual Residents' Meeting on the 26th March to initiate a debate and hear your views on the two topics of the Future High Street and Devolution. What would you like to see or not to see happen to Fleet's high street?

What services would you be prepared to, or not to fund at the local level which have previously been supplied by higher authorities?

There will be the usual presentation on what the Town Council achieved last year and how your money was spent, but the main event of the evening will be hearing your views on the two key topics.

We look forward to seeing as many of you as can make it on the 26th March. If you cannot make it, we would still like to hear your views and we will make it possible for you to communicate with us in as many ways as possible.

Although we are coming into Spring, this is the first Town Talk of 2019 so, a very belated Happy New Year!
