Protecting Fleet

Fleet Neighbourhood Plan Adopted

The Fleet Neighbourhood Plan has now been adopted by Hart District Council and will be used as part of the planning process to decide planning applications within the Fleet Town Council area, give some protection over future development and achieve the vision to "Create an accessible, sustainable, green town with an active population and a vibrant business, cultural and community focus".

The Fleet Neighbourhood Plan was adopted in November after the Referendum held on the 7th October 2019 resulted in 2294 'Yes' votes as opposed to 681 'No' votes. You can view the adopted Neighbourhood Plan at www.hart.gov.uk/fleet or via www.fleet-tc.gov.uk under the Projects tab.

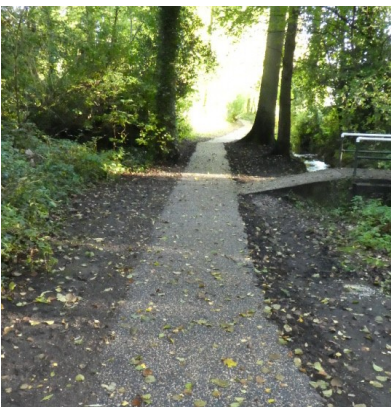
Action Day - Saturday 16th May 2020

Oakley Footpaths

Residents will now find walking through Oakley Park Woods a much less muddy experience after the installation of a new path.

The new path connects Kings Road to Oakley Park, allowing users to gain access to the play park and providing an easier commute to work year round, without the worry of muddy shoes in adverse weather. The path also benefits less-abled bodied residents who may have previously had difficulties passing through the woodland areas.

This water-permeable, low maintenance surface is made from recycled rubber granules and allows for movement of tree roots without causing damage to either the path or trees.

Calthorpe Park Play Area

Drainage works were completed during December 2019 on the lower field in Calthorpe Park in preparation for the installation of a new play area. The Play area will consist of 3 play zones, interlinking paths, safety surfaces, accessible equipment and disabled parking.

At the end of 2019 a Tender to design and install play equipment was launched and bids have now been received and evaluated against the brief with a recommendation due to go through Council in February. The contract will have a completion date of July this year, just in time for the Summer holidays.

The Harlington Conditions Survey

A brief update - the Condition Survey has now been completed and the final report is currently in progress. It is hoped that the final condition report will be taken to Council for consideration before the Summer. As a reminder the Condition Survey is to determine the overall state of the building and the integrity of the concrete frame.

Gurkha Square Market

In anticipation of entering into an agreement with Hart District Council "to lease Gurkha Square car park each Saturday for the purpose of establishing a high quality general market" Fleet Town Council tendered and awarded a contract for a professional operator to take over the management of the market. The new operator will take over the market once the final lease details have been agreed between Fleet Town Council and Hart District Council.

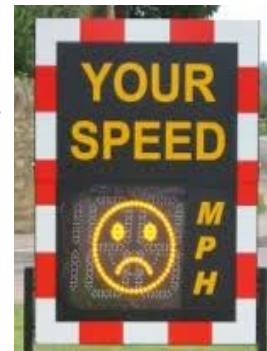


Wanted - Speedwatch Volunteers

Police forces are making more use of police support volunteers. The SpeedWatch group in Fleet is organised by the police and supported by Fleet Town Council. SpeedWatch is made up of local volunteers and its role is to remind drivers of the speed limits. Small teams of volunteers work at the side of the road and use a device that displays in large numbers the speeds of passing vehicles. When a passing vehicle is traveling above a certain speed, the volunteers record its details and pass them onto the police who will get in touch with the vehicle's Registered Keeper.

If you have good eyesight, a fair knowledge of car models, are able to stand at the side of the road for about an hour, have good team work, patience and are able to fill out forms with reasonable speed and accuracy then please consider volunteering.

Age 17+ only. Training provided. You can volunteer Monday - Sunday, Mornings or Afternoons. Each volunteer might take part in 2 one hour sessions a month. Register your interest at www.volunteernorthhants.org - enter 'Speedwatch' in the 'search for opportunities' bar.

Working together to make Fleet Carbon Neutral

Fleet Town Council is determined to ensure that Fleet is not only the best place to live and work but is also a leader in cutting its carbon footprint, with the ultimate target of making Fleet Carbon Neutral. This is something that every household in Fleet needs to buy into, “someone else” cannot make this happen, it is down to each and everyone of us to play our part.

The Council will be looking to dedicate resources to not only reduce its own Carbon Footprint but to work with the residents of Fleet to achieve this aim—more information will follow in the next few months.

However, in the meantime, below is a list of simple things that we can all do to try and improve our carbon footprint, compiled using information from a recent article in The Independent:

Meat & Dairy - The meat/dairy industry is responsible for 14.5% of manmade global greenhouse gas emissions (mainly from feed production/processing and methane that beef and sheep produce). Research has shown that every day you forgo meat/dairy you can reduce your carbon footprint by 8 pounds, in fact giving up eating meat and dairy products permanently i.e. going Vegan can reduce a person’s carbon footprint by up to 73% while going vegetarian can reduce it by up to 50% compared to that of a meat eaters.

You may not want to or may not be able to become vegetarian/vegan but there are still small changes that can be made to reduce your carbon footprint, be it reducing meat/dairy consumption by implementing one meatless meal a week or buying locally sourced/UK meat to save on food miles (the distance food is transported from the time of its making until it reaches the consumer). If you are interested in making the switch (or giving it a try) there are loads of great vegetarian options and meat/dairy substitutes out there! The Vegetarian Society has some useful information and tips www.vegsoc.org

Shopping - ‘bags for life’ avoid the use of single use paper/plastic bags. Buying from local businesses reduces emissions from the transport of goods or if online shopping, some companies offer a reduced packaging option. Another simple thing that can be done when shopping is checking the ingredients list e.g. does the product contain sustainable palm oil—palm oil is a major cause of deforestation. Great news guys, the oil in Nutella is sustainable so get your toast ready!

Reduce your waste - freezing/refrigerating leftovers to eat later on can save food waste. There’s a variety of eco friendly homeware available such as a reusable water bottles, glass food containers and reusable beeswax wraps (a replacement for Clingfilm). Ensuring to separate out glass and recycling from general waste is another simple thing that can be done as is starting a compost for vegetable peelings if you have a garden.

Clothing - donating any unwanted items to charity shops or clothes banks rather than throwing them in the bin reduces waste as does buying less ‘fast fashion’ items and buying from more sustainable companies. There’s also loads of online sites e.g. Depop/Thread Up where you can buy/sell second hand clothes, you may even find a designer bargain! Washing clothes at 30 degrees and limiting tumble dryer usage will also save energy (and money).

Home

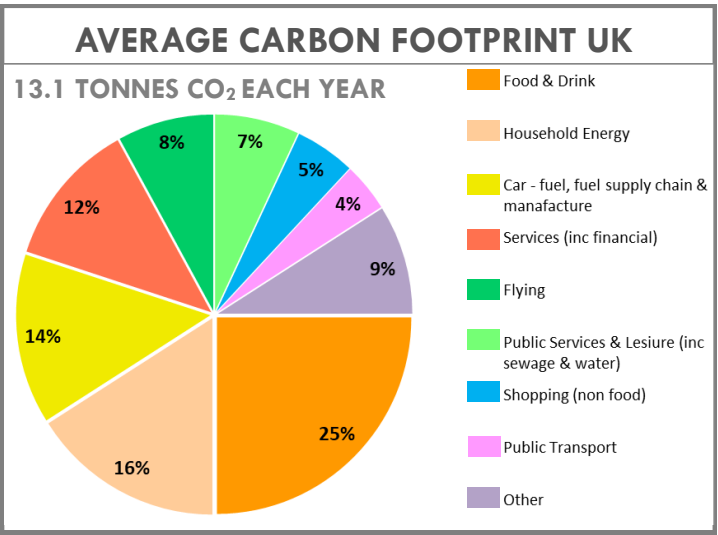
- LED light bulbs may cost more but they use 75% less energy, and last 25 times longer than incandescent lighting
- Switching off lights when leaving the room and unplugging devices when they are not in use will save electricity
- Low-flow showerheads reduce hot water use and can save 350 pounds of CO2. Taking Showers instead of baths can also save energy and water
- Being conscious of heating use in the winter and using less air conditioning in the summer will save power (fans require less electricity so you needn’t melt)
- Energy auditing your home and switching to green energy providers can improve your carbon footprint - in fact, three of the Big Six energy companies – British Gas, NPower and E-on have tariffs that offer 100% green energy
- Having more plants at home/ more trees in the garden can also improve your carbon footprint. Did you know a tree can absorb as much as 48 pounds of carbon dioxide a year and sequester 1 ton of carbon dioxide by the time it reaches 40 years old!

Transport

- Driving less and walking more/using public transport
- If shopping for a new car you could look into purchasing a hybrid or electric vehicle
- When going on holiday taking non-stop flights rather than ones with layovers can save fuel/emissions from landings and take-offs
- Flying economy class shares the flight’s carbon emissions among more passengers—first class can result in 9 times more carbon emissions per person

Average Carbon Footprint - UK

A Carbon Footprint measures the total greenhouse gas emissions caused directly and indirectly by a person, measured in tonnes of carbon dioxide equivalent (a standard unit which expresses the impact of different greenhouse gases).

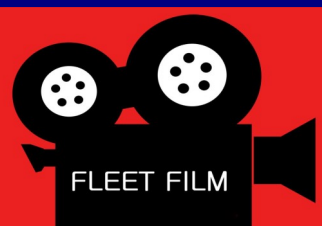

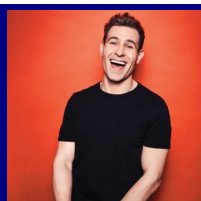

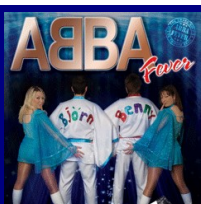
