### 3. Fleet's Platinum Jubilee Celebrations – 2nd to 5th June 2022

A small group of local volunteers, coordinated by Fleet Town Council, is working with local groups/organisations to bring together a 4-day programme of events to mark the unique occasion of the Platinum Jubilee. The events will run from the 2nd to the 5th June 2022.

The group form the "Fleet Platinum Jubilee Committee" which includes representatives from the local British Legion, Hart Lions, Fleet Lions, our local Schools, Scouts, Guides, our local Churches and representatives of both Fleet Town Council and Hart District Council. They all feel strongly that we need to do everything we can to, not only celebrate our longest reigning monarch, but to help our community recover from the last two years. The Platinum Jubilee Celebrations give us a wonderful opportunity to do just that.



You will be receiving much more information about the programme of events but, in brief, the four days will run as follows:

**Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> June** The lighting of a beacon in Calthorpe Park, in line with the beacons being lit throughout the UK and across the Commonwealth. The beacon lighting will be accompanied by a short fireworks display, a Fun Fair and a children's lantern parade.

**Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> June** A Day of Sport, including Bike Rides, Fun Run, archery, football and much, much more, accompanied by a regatta and paddle-boarding on the Basingstoke Canal.

**Saturday 4th June** A Jubilee Parade and Premier & Vintage Car Procession through the town centre. The Parade will include our local scouts and guides, as well as many other local groups and organisations.

Sunday 5<sup>th</sup> June The four day programme will conclude with a morning Act of Worship in Gurkha Square, followed by a giant street party and entertainment along our high street, with street food stalls and live performances from a stage in Gurkha Square.

These four days will be a wonderful opportunity for us to come together to celebrate our recovery from the loneliness and isolation that has been part of the last two years and to acknowledge the 70 years of service of our Queen.

### And onto some other updates...

### The future of Fleet's Saturday Market

Our Saturday Market has had a chequered career over the past several years and we think that we will all agree that it needs a fresh approach.

We are pleased to tell you that in January 2022, the Council agreed that a Community Interest Company (CIC) should be formed to operate a new weekly Saturday Market, plus a specialist Sunday Market once a month. Two of our new Councillors have been heavily involved in taking forward the plans for this revival and the Annual Residents' Meeting gives you the opportunity to question the plans for the future of the market.



### **Chairman's Coffee Mornings**

Each month, prior to the pandemic, our Chairman, Bob Schofield, together with the relevant Ward Councillors, hosted a Residents' Coffee Morning. Those invited were randomly selected from all residents living in a particular Ward within the Town Council area.

These events have proved to be a really great away of finding out what people think about living in Fleet and is not restricted to talking about only what Fleet Town Council does in the town, but what is good and not so good over a far ranging set of topics.

Probably one of the most consistent questions is "who is responsible for what around the

Town". We have hopefully helped clarify the situation and the panel on the back page of this newsletter sets out the headline responsibilities of the County, District and Town Councils.



### **Chairman's Musings**

"This is the last Town Talk of the third, four-year term of Fleet Town Council. We must have been enjoying ourselves because the time has just flown, but equally it has been virtually a two-year term with the COVID-19 chaos of the last two years. We had to cancel all our meetings and close down The Harlington and Ancells Farm Community Centre but at least we were able to keep our parks and playgrounds operating so you could all take your daily exercise. The parks became little oases of sanity.





We were temporarily allowed to hold virtual meetings and the most

frequent phrase to kick-off every meeting was "you're muted". Just when we had honed our virtual meeting skills, the Government said we had to return to live meetings and there was no choice but to comply.



We are now seeing things slowly return to some semblance of normality, if that is what pre-Covid was, but it is understandable that there are mixed feelings about suddenly throwing caution to the wind - we are experiencing some of the clubs and activities returning with great support and others being more cautious. And of course, there are the last-minute disruptions such as Blondie (or at least our version) testing positive for COVID-19 the afternoon before the show, ouch!

It is not long now to the end of April when every Town Councillor has to stand down and, if willing, put themselves up for re-election for a further 4 year period, but new blood is always welcome. If you have strong views or are just passionate about our Town why not consider becoming a Town Councillor and help shape the future of Fleet? Details of how you can put yourself forward as a potential candidate are included on Page 3.



We had hoped, as ever, that we could offer you some news on the future of The Harlington and the potential development of the Civic Quarter. The initial public engagement was meant to start at the end of February, but because of a critical resourcing issue, Hart District Council has put the public exhibition and conversation off until May, after the elections. Let's be optimistic and say that "no news is good news".

Talking of good news, I hope that many of you saw that Charlotte Harris, a FLEET resident, together with Jessica Oliver, from Gloucestershire, set a new record, by

5 days, for rowing across the Atlantic. Our sincerest congratulations on such an amazing achievement. I wonder if Jessica practised her skills on the Basingstoke Canal?

As our lead article (Pages 1-3) states, we will be hosting a live Annual Residents' Meeting this year, and all being well it will be live streamed for those who are unable to physically attend. It will be an opportunity for you to hear some interesting information, not just from the Town Council, but also from one of our local GPs and a representative of the police, but equally importantly it is a chance for you to tell us your views and ask any pertinent questions.

Finally, I feel very privileged to have chaired Fleet Town Council for the last 4 years and particularly to have witnessed the commitment of so many residents volunteering for a wide variety of activities to support their fellow residents: it is part of what makes Fleet such a real community." - Bob Schofield



### VENUE UPDATE

The majority of local people will be aware that the venue was used as a vaccination centre throughout most of 2021 and thanks to all the NHS doctors, organisers and vaccinators, supported by an army of local volunteers, tens of thousands of people in the area have received their vaccination. The building is currently still being used for boosters/vaccinations although these are now being administered in the café area allowing more user groups to use the main auditorium.

2021 saw some venue re-decorating and improvements including two large screens in the Auditorium which will give audiences a better overall experience and enables us to offer live-streaming on selected shows using a new seven camera system, record live band videos and take our conferencing services to the next level.
